The **Earl Lectures** are a series of public lectures on religion held at the <u>Pacific School of Religion</u> in <u>Berkeley</u>, <u>California</u>. Founded in 1901, they are supported by an endowment of Edwin T. Earl. They are open to members of the general public, and since 1921, a pastoral seminary has been linked with the talks. Speakers' fees have been used to fund the seminary. They are a three-day event which normally takes place each year in January. Speakers who have delivered the talks include <u>Maya Angelou</u>, <u>Paul Tillich</u> (1963), <u>Theodore Roosevelt</u> (1911)^[1], <u>Elie Wiesel</u> and Kosuke Koyama (1975).
