

The **Earl Lectures** are a series of public lectures on religion held at the [Pacific School of Religion](#) in [Berkeley, California](#). Founded in 1901, they are supported by an endowment of Edwin T. Earl. They are open to members of the general public, and since 1921, a pastoral seminary has been linked with the talks. Speakers' fees have been used to fund the seminary. They are a three-day event which normally takes place each year in January. Speakers who have delivered the talks include [Maya Angelou](#), [Paul Tillich](#) (1963), [Theodore Roosevelt](#) (1911)<sup>[1]</sup>, [Elie Wiesel](#) and [Kosuke Koyama](#) (1975).
